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22 **INTRODUCTION**  
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24 **The fishery:** composed from several elements that must be properly legislated to secure  
25 biodiversity in ecosystem that supports indigenous groups of humans and other indigenous species that  
26 are within same ecosystem. The fish species, the fisherman, the fish farms, the fish processing, the fish  
27 markets, the fish consumers and other found codependents of the fish industry.  
28

29 **The fish species:** quality and quantity of indigenous fish species and the zooplankton have been  
30 affected by fishing laws that do not focus on the indigenous ecosystem and indigenous believes of the  
31 Arcticus Blancus indigenous persons. Commercial fishing of krill and shrimp is critically reducing the



32 abilities of other indigenous polar species of fish such: cod, char, halibut, pollock and salmon to sustain  
33 own colonies. Uninterrupted by the commercial fishing ecosystem is critical to the sustainment of all  
34 indigenous polar organisms not only in the oceans, seas, rivers of the Arctic and Antarctic, but also on the  
35 indigenous polar lands occupied by indigenous polar mammals and the Arcticus Blancus indigenous  
36 group. Existence of non-indigenous fishery is a clear disadvantage to the entire polar ecosystem against  
37 the Arcticus Blancus indigenous believes and indigenous species needs and functions.

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39 **The commercial fishery** based on systematic extinction of the polar ecosystem must be stopped  
40 by indigenous regulations vital to ecosystem preservation. Arcticus Blancus indigenous regulations  
41 should consist of full control of entire fishery that would regulate the types and quantity of the species  
42 permitted to catch within regulated by the indigenous provisions of time. Regulators must remember that  
43 non-indigenous commercial fishery not attached to climate in same way as the Arcticus Blancus is  
44 attached by its climate symbiosed characteristics developed always move away after the ecosystem upon  
45 which they benefit has been destroyed by commercial fishing entities permitted by states addressed in this  
46 proposal.

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48 **The fisherman:** current laws do not focus on the protection of the indigenous fisherman that had  
49 established it symbiosed fishing occupations long before the non-indigenous groups. Fishing open to all  
50 groups causes the indigenous groups to lose the connection to the indigenous polar ecosystem attached to  
51 their indigenous phenotype thru physical characteristics of polar hair. Arcticus blancus indigenous rights  
52 to have a full control over polar fishery need to become a strict law in a fair to non-indigenous fisherman  
53 transition.

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55 **The fish farms:** current laws do not protect the fish species farmed in enclosed nets as in the case  
56 of the salmon from disintegration of salmon healthy connective tissue and teeth observed in the wild  
57 salmon. Infestation of the sea lice in farmed salmon cannot be controlled and that is a threat of salmon  
58 and all other species of fish. Farmed salmon are kept in small nets that prevent fish healthy  
59 cardiovascular circulation that is also a key to fish strong immunity, pathogen deterrence, and physical  
60 condition responsible for building salmon strong body. Wild salmon travels thousands of kilometers.  
61 Farmed salmon do not travel more than the circumference of the net that keeps them.

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63           **The fish factories:** current laws do not protect the indigenous fishery workers in fish processing  
64 factories that causes the non-indigenous workers to be a primary choice for the owners and operators of  
65 the fish processing factories that are focused on the profitability. Laws permitting the fish processing  
66 factories to process Arcticus Blancus indigenous fish with the non-indigenous workforce consisting of  
67 migrants and seasonal workers and non-indigenous clients located in far places of the world outside the  
68 indigenous polar territory of Arcticus Blancus where the fish belongs are a serious threat to the  
69 indigenous groups fish species ecosystem and Arcticus Blancus sustainment that falls in to the risk  
70 categories and risk factors of genocide.

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72           **Indigenous fish processing** and technology in the fish processing plants is not regulated and does  
73 not involve indigenous guidelines of fish processing that are aligned with the Arcticus Blancus: fish  
74 processing religious guidelines; continuous tests and improvements to: machines, production processes,  
75 production procedures with aim to increase products quality and work automation reliving employees  
76 from continues repetitive monotonic tasks while increasing the health and hygiene standards for the  
77 facilities, fish and employees.

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79           **The fish markets:** commercial sale points and consumer sale points of the polar indigenous fish  
80 species sold raw by the fisherman and sold fresh or frozen by the fish processing factories for the  
81 consumption by clients within the indigenous territory and for the clients outside of the indigenous  
82 territory is not controlled by the Arcticus Blancus indigenous group. There is currently no working law  
83 within the sates addressed in this proposal that would actively protect the supply of the indigenous  
84 species of the fish to the Arcticus Blancus indigenous persons that consume the indigenous polar fish  
85 species as the religious and nutritional measure of life, sustainment and connection to own indigenous  
86 ecosystem.

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88           **Indigenous businesses** supported by necessary infrastructure would assure a steady supply, fair  
89 access and strict control of the quantity, quality and health of the Arcticus Blancus indigenous polar  
90 species of fish for the indigenous persons-entities on the indigenous territory and indigenous persons  
91 outside of the indigenous territory. Non-indigenous persons-entities in the Arcticus Blancus indigenous  
92 territory and outside would be supported without endangerment of the Arcticus Blancus indigenous  
93 persons.

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126 *Biological Resources* in charge of all permits for commercial and non-commercial fishing activities in the  
127 Arcticus Blancus polar territory for the indigenous and non-indigenous persons and entities.

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### 129 **Aquaculture Closure**

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- 131 1. In a period of 10 years all of the salmon fish farms must be closed.
- 132 2. Closure of all aquacultures will be based on the recommended plan of closure that should include  
133 the risk of the farms to the biodiversity of the farmed species of the fish, any type of other hazards  
134 to the environment, ecosystem and human health that will have to include the quality of the farm  
135 operations and farm infrastructures.
- 136 3. Salmon processing factories that lose access to the farmed salmon will have to switch to non-  
137 farmed fish species such as cod, char, halibut, pollock to remain in business until the retirement of  
138 the last worker that was hired prior the entry of this proposal into the law or retirement of the  
139 place of employment.
- 140 4. Any farms deemed for closure within 10-year period that meet same closure criteria and need to  
141 close in different time will be given later closure date if indigenous persons owned and operated  
142 in whole or bigger fraction. Ethnic Hair Quantum can be used to determine disputes.

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### 144 **Employment Protection**

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- 146 1. The owners and operators of non-indigenous fishery that includes all of their own marine and land  
147 fishery infrastructure will not be able to hire or train new non-indigenous fishery workers on a  
148 permanent contracts and without the permission from the *Department of Protection of Indigenous*  
149 *Education and Employment* that will regulate all employment in the time of transition from non-  
150 indigenous fishery to indigenous fishery until the retirement of last non-indigenous employee and  
151 retirement of last non-indigenous marine and land fishery infrastructure such as boats, fish  
152 processing plants, etc.
- 153 2. The plan of closure of farmed salmon industry should protect the indigenous and non-indigenous  
154 employers and employees by giving all employees that lost the employment in the salmon  
155 farming and salmon processing a priority to transfer to other salmon processing employers until  
156 the age of retirement. To make sure the indigenous employees are not discriminated the  
157 *Department of Protection of Indigenous Education and Employment* will keep a list of all



158 employees that lost jobs and seek a new employer in salmon processing and other fish related  
159 occupations.

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161 **Indigenous Fishery and Indigenous Consumers Protection**

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163 Arcticus Blancus proposal for the indigenous fishery protection and indigenous consumers  
164 protection not related to the salmon farming and salmon processing should be released by Eugenix P.S.A.  
165 in the separate update, annex or proposal in upcoming months.
