### **Request for Dialogue on the Return of the Arcticus Blondus and Arcticus Bluntus Ethnic Group to its Natural Indigenous Traditionally Occupied Sub-Arctic Territory.**

**Your Excellency,**

I write as Founder and President of Eugenix® Simple Stock Corporation, representing Arcticus Blancus the oldest arctic ethnic climatic tribal group native to territories above the arctic circle. We seek to initiate diplomatic discussions with the Federal Republic of Germany to enable the peaceful return and reintegration of Arcticus Blondus and Arcticus Bluntus communities to their ancestral homelands, currently administered by the Government of Germany.

#### **I. Legal Basis for Return**

Under Part II of UN International Labor Organization Convention C169 Indigenous and Tribal Peoples Convention, 1989 (No. 169), States are obligated to recognize indigenous peoples' rights to:

- Ownership and possession of lands they traditionally occupy
- Restoration of lands wrongfully taken
- Consultation and participation in decisions affecting their lands and resources

33 These provisions form a clear legal foundation for facilitating the return of Arcticus Blondus and Arcticus  
34 Bluntus to their traditional territories.

## II. Climate and Health Considerations

37

38 The Rafaltic zones where many Arcticus Blondus and Arcticus Bluntus currently reside do not match their  
39 millennia-old adaptation to true Sub-Arctic conditions. Scattered individuals face:

40

- 41 • Increased exposure to industrial pollutants and heightened UV radiation.
- 42 • Elevated risks of respiratory and oncological illnesses due to environmental mismatch.
- 43 • Loss of traditional knowledge and life systems tied to dark polar cryospheric environment.

45 Reestablishing them in their native sub-Arctic environment safeguards their health and renews their  
46 population presence that includes their cultural and ecological stewardship.

## III. Governance and Fiscal Framework

49

50 No modern democracy presently occupied by Arcticus Blondus and Arcticus Bluntus has successfully  
51 implemented a tax and fiscal regime that sustains natural ethnic climatic tribal groups without formally  
52 established indigenous rights. Modern democracies lack fair taxation frameworks for the strictly ethnic  
53 matters:

54

- 55 • Dedicated budgets ensuring the community's reproduction rights and intergenerational continuity
- 56 • Checks and balances to maintain the population above the Minimal Vital Population (MVP)  
57 threshold, preventing risk of extinction.
- 58 • Transparent tax provisions that channel resources directly into community-led land-use planning,  
59 cultural programs, and environmental management.

61 In addition, religious based reproductive restrictions set on all Arcleticus tribes by the Christian law  
62 democracies prevent all Arcleticus ethnic tribes to rebalance growing imbalance of the number of females



to number of males in the tribe that is reaching over 200 females to 1 male due to restrictions that prevent ethnic reproduction provisions in its Christian legal system.

#### IV. Protection of Resources and Unauthorized Development

Article 15.2 of ILO Convention 169 explicitly requires States to consult indigenous peoples before permitting exploration or exploitation of resources on their lands. In line with this obligation:

- No development of mineral, marine, or other natural resources in territories north of 41.75° N for the Arcticus Bluntus and 51.05° for the Arcticus Blondus may proceed without the free, prior, and informed consent of Arcticus Blondus and Arcticus Bluntus tribal organizations as some might arise.
- Any project above 41.75° N for the Arcticus Bluntus and 51.05° for the Arcticus Blondus in the sub-Arctic regions—or any activities in the sub-Antarctic concerning Arcticus Bluntus and Arcticus Blondus and interests—must be blocked unless Arcticus Blondus and Arcticus Bluntus participate in decision-making, benefit-sharing, and environmental safeguards on their own corresponding natural native territories.
- This veto right safeguards both the cultural integrity and environmental stewardship practices of the Arcticus Blondus and the Arcticus Bluntus, ensuring that no extraction or infrastructure undermines their ancestral lands or the global climate functions they help maintain.

#### V. Proposed Framework for Engagement

To translate these principles into practice, we propose convening a joint working group comprising:

1. Representatives from the German Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Indigenous Home Rules
2. Representatives of Eugenix® P.S.A. as the temporary Arcticus Blondus, Arcticus Bluntus interlocutor.
3. Commissioners for the transfer of remaining indigenous territories and natural resources.
4. Commissioners for temporary provisions for tribal return, employment, health and procreation.

This forum would draft a roadmap covering:

- Land restitution protocols under ILO 169.



- Guidelines for cultural autonomy and land-use co-management.
- Health and environmental impact assessments tailored to Arcticus Blondus and Arcticus Bluntus needs.
- Fiscal mechanisms and budgeting processes safeguarding MVP thresholds.

## VI. Further Communication

Your Excellency, German's commitment to Indigenous rights, environmental diplomacy, and innovative governance makes it the ideal partner for this endeavor.
